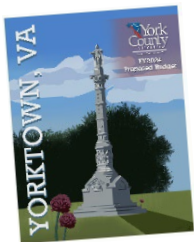

County Administrator to Present Proposed FY2024 Budget



The Board of Supervisors meets Tuesday (3/21) at 6 p.m. in York Hall (301 Main Street). The first item on the [agenda](#) is the presentation of the Proposed Fiscal Year 2024 Budget by County Administrator Neil Morgan. The meeting is open to the public and televised live on WYCG-TV (Cox 46, Verizon 38) and livestreamed on the County’s [website](#). The proposed budget will be posted on the website Wednesday (3/22).
