



## **Board of Supervisors Adopts Budget, Lowers Tax Rates**

At this week's meeting, the Board approved the Fiscal Year 2024 Budget along with the tax rates for Calendar Year 2023. The Real Estate tax rate has been reduced one cent from \$0.78 to \$0.77, and personal property drops ten cents to \$3.90 (both rates are per \$100 of assessed valuation). You can read the budget <a href="here">here</a>. Taxes are due semi-annually on June 25 and December 5. York County residents age 65 or over, and certain disabled persons, may be eligible for real estate tax relief (certain eligibility criteria apply).
