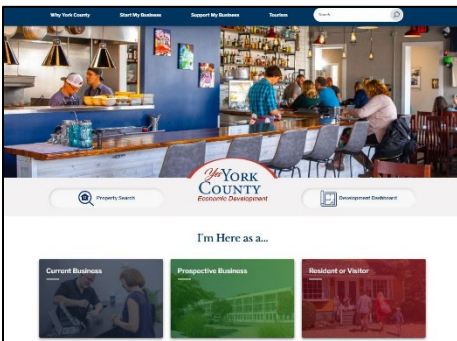

Parkway Renovations Beginning Soon

According to information released from the National Park Service, work on the 90-year-old parkway will begin soon. One of the first phases will include the closure of the parkway from Yorktown to the Old Williamsburg Road overpass starting mid-August and continuing to the winter of 2024-2025. Other portions will close as the work progresses. Detours will be put in place and well-marked for motorists.
